## TERMS OF REFERENCE: NICOLE SEREDA AWARD FOR VOLUNTEER EXCELLENCE

- 1. The skaters selected must have exhibited a positive attitude, a strong commitment to the club, the ability to encourage others, a strong sense of volunteerism within the club and community, an ongoing willingness to help, and a passion for skating.
- 2. The committee will select recipients (no nomination process). At a minimum, the committee will consist of Nicole Sereda, one board member and one paid employee.
- 3. In Grade 12 year: Scholarship(s) to be used for post-secondary education. Receipt will be required prior to providing funds to recipient(s).
- 4. High School: Bursary(s) in the form of a credit to be used for skating at Skate Saskatoon.
- 5. The awards will be presented at the Ice Show.
- 6. The scholarship(s) will be \$1,000 per recipient(s) and the bursary(s) will be \$1,000 per recipient(s) based on an approximate timetable of five years.
- 7. 2019 was the first year of the awards.
- 8. There can be multiple recipients of each type of award in a single year, or there can be no recipients of one or both types of awards in a single year.
- 9. Volunteerism does not include Program Assisting, since member account credits are received pursuant to the Policy regarding Program Assistants.
- 10. Volunteering includes skaters helping at events such as; Assessment Days, Photo days, Winter WonderSkate, Ice Shows, Competitions, decorating for Christmas, etc.
